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Best Practice: Share a simple "Who to Contact" list with managers, coaches, and volunteers so everyone knows where to go for help during the season.

CHILD PROTECTION

Little League requires every chartered league to follow a set of core child protection policies to help keep children safe. Protecting players is our highest priority, and these policies ensure volunteers understand their responsibilities both on and off the field.

Your league has confirmed that all of the following policies are in place:

1. Annual Background Checks

CHELTENHAM LL confirms that all volunteers with regular contact with players complete annual background checks through J.D. Palatine (JDP), as required by Little League Regulation I(c) 8 and 9. Anyone with a disqualifying offense is prohibited from participating in any Little League activity. Background check laws vary across the country, and any additional requirements that apply to your league can be found at <https://www.littleleague.org/player-safety/child-protection-program/state-laws-background-checks-leagues/>. Your league is responsible for understanding and complying with any applicable state laws regarding background checks.

2. Annual Abuse Awareness Training

CHELTENHAM LL requires all volunteers to complete the Little League Abuse Awareness Training each year before assuming any duties. This training helps volunteers recognize, prevent, and respond to misconduct and abuse. 3. Mandatory Reporting of Child Abuse

CHELTENHAM LL acknowledges that all volunteers are mandatory reporters under federal law and must report suspected child abuse, including sexual abuse, to the proper authorities within 24 hours. Reports should also be shared with the League President and District Administrator. State reporting requirements vary, and any laws that apply to your league can be found at <https://www.littleleague.org/player-safety/child-protection-program/state-specific-information-child-abuse/>. Your league is responsible for understanding and complying with any applicable state laws.

4. Non-Retaliation Policy

CHELTENHAM LL has adopted a policy that prohibits retaliation against anyone who makes a good-faith report of suspected abuse or misconduct. This ensures volunteers feel safe coming forward with concerns.

5. One-on-One Interaction Policy

CHELTENHAM LL has adopted the Little League One-on-One Interaction Policy, which requires that all interactions between adults and minors be observable and interruptible by another adult. This reduces opportunities for misconduct while still supporting positive mentoring relationships.

Best Practice: Reinforce child protection expectations clearly and consistently so volunteers know what to do and who to contact.

- Review expectations with all volunteers at the start of each season.
- Make reporting steps clear and easy to follow.
- Keep child protection policies easily accessible.

Pennsylvania Judiciary Web Portal

Cheltenham Little League is committed to providing a safe, secure, and positive environment for all players and families. As part of our comprehensive volunteer screening process, we utilize the Pennsylvania Judiciary Web Portal to conduct additional background checks on prospective volunteers.

This resource allows the league to review publicly available court records within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, helping to identify any concerning history that may impact an individual's eligibility to serve in a volunteer role. The use of this tool is an added layer of protection that supplements our requirements our required state clearances, Little League background checks, and abuse awareness training.

By incorporating the Pennsylvania Judiciary Web Portal into our screening procedures, Cheltenham Little League strengthens its commitment to player safety, ensures responsible volunteer participation, and upholds the highest standards of integrity within our league community.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Being prepared for unexpected situations helps keep players, volunteers, and families safe. The information below highlights the emergency procedures and contacts in place during all league activities.

Emergency Action Plan

Emergencies can happen when you least expect them. A clear and accessible EAP helps volunteers respond quickly, communicate effectively, and take the right steps to keep players and families safe.

CHELTENHAM LL has an Emergency Action Plan in place. Regularly reviewing this plan with volunteers and players helps ensure everyone knows how to respond quickly and confidently during an emergency.

STEP ACTION

- 1 Incident Occurs
- 2 Coach/Volunteer identifies emergency
- 3 Call 911 (if needed)
- 4 Notify Safety Officer
- 5 Safety Officer notifies League President/Board
- 6 Team Parent communicates with families
- 7 League-wide communicate if necessary

AED Access Plan

An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is located in the snack stand (Woodland Complex Only). In the event of a cardiac emergency, call 911 immediately, send a designated individual to retrieve the AED, and begin CPR if trained. Ensure clear access for responders.

Incident Documentation Process (Within 24 HRS)

All incidents must be documented using official Cheltenham Little League forms located on the website:

- Incident/Injury Reporting Form (for injuries/near misses).
- Non-Injury Incident Report Form (for safety or behavioral incidents).

Forms must be completed as soon as possible and submitted to the Safety Officer. Serious incidents should be reported immediately after the situation is stabilized.

Coordination with First Responders

Call 911 and provide the location:

- Woodland Complex: 650 Woodland Av, Cheltenham, PA 19012
- Gimbel Complex: 276 Harrison Ave, Elkins Park, PA 19027

Assign a volunteer to meet EMS at the entrance and guide them to the field.

Keep access paths clear and provide any relevant information to responders.

Response to Serious Incidents

Medical Emergencies:

- Call 911.

- Provide first aid within training.
- Retrieve AED (if needed).
- Keep area clear.

Severe Weather:

- Stop play immediately.
- Clear fields.
- Move participants to safe shelter.
- Monitor conditions.

Security Threats:

- Secure players.
- Contact authorities.
- Follow evacuation or lockdown procedures as appropriate.

Missing Child Procedure

- Notify Safety Officer.
- Alert volunteers.
- Search area.
- Call 911 if not found within 10 minutes.

Crowd Management

- Keep emergency lanes clear.
- Keep spectators off fields.
- Direct crowds as needed.

Weather Policies

1. Safety First

The safety of our players, coaches, volunteers, and families is our top priority. Games and practices may be canceled or delayed due to:

- Severe weather conditions: thunderstorms, lightning, heavy rain, extreme heat/cold, poor air quality.
- Unsafe field conditions: standing water, mud, or damage that risks player injury.

2. Decision-Making

- The League Safety Officer, President, and/or Division Commissioners will review weather and field conditions.
- Final decisions will be made as early as possible – typically at least 1-2 hours before the scheduled event.
- Umpires and coaches may also call a game at the field if conditions change suddenly.

3. Make – Up Games

- Whenever possible, canceled games may or may not be rescheduled (Games may be added at the end of the season).
- Coaches will notify families of make-up dates as soon as fields and schedules allow.
- Practices may not be rescheduled.

4. Parent Notification of Cancellation

- Families will be informed of weather cancellations through multiple channels:

o League Website & Social Media: Updates will be posted on the homepage and official Facebook/Instagram pages.

o Email Alerts: An email will be sent to all registered families.

o Text Alerts/League App (if available): Quick text or app push notifications will be sent out when possible.

o Team Managers/Coaches: Coaches will follow – up with direct message or phone calls to confirm.

PLEASE NOTE: If you don't receive an official cancellation, assume your game or practice is still on.

Evacuation Routes

Woodland Complex (Fields 1-5):

Primary evacuation assembly area: Use the main parking lot/front entrance along Woodland Av as the primary evacuation destination. The Woodland Complex location page confirms the site address, and public listing info indicates on-site parking and restrooms, which supports using the front parking area as the clearest public-facing exit point.

Recommended evacuation routes by area

Fields 1 and 2: Exit spectators, players, and volunteers by the nearest walkway leading toward the snack stand/front-side circulation path, then continue to the main parking lot/front entrance on Woodland Ave. If the area near the snack stand is blocked, use the next-closest walkway toward the front of the complex and proceed to the same assembly point. This route fits the published Woodland Complex layout and the known front-of-site access.

Field 3: Use the pathway leading directly toward the parking lot side of the complex. Move all participants and spectators to the main parking lot/front entrance. Because Field 3 is near the parking-side circulation in the complex layout, this should be treated as the most direct primary route.

Field 4 and 5: Use the closest interior walking path away from the outfield/fence lines and toward the front/parking-lot side of the complex. If the most direct front-side route is unsafe, use a secondary interior path that reconnects with the main complex walkway system, then continue to the main parking lot/front entrance on Woodland Ave. The league's published map confirms the Woodland complex field grouping, and this route structure is the safest general approach for the rear-most fields.

Secondary evacuation area: If the main parking lot/front entrance is unsafe or inaccessible, move evacuees to a secondary perimeter area long Woodland Ave, clear of traffic lanes and emergency vehicle access, until responders or league officials direct further movement. The key principle is to move everyone away from fenced play areas and into an open exterior area with road access.

Gimbel Complex (Fields 7-8)

Primary Evacuation Assembly Area

- Main Parking Area/Entrance along Harrison Ave.
- This is the primary evacuation destination for all players, coaches, and spectators.

Field 7 (Primary/Closest to Entrance):

- Exit the field using the nearest dugout gate or spectator opening.
- Proceed along the main walkway toward Harrison Ave.
- Continue directly to the main parking lot/entrance assembly area.

Field 8 (Secondary/Rear Field):

- Exit via the closest field gate or sideline opening.
- Use the interior walkway connecting to Field 7/front area.
- Proceed toward the main entrance along Harrison Ave.
- Continue to the primary assembly area in the parking lot.

Bleachers & Spectator Areas

- Move away from seating areas immediately.
- Follow clearly visible walkways toward the front entrance.
- Avoid cutting across active field areas if games are in progress.
- Proceed to the main parking lot assembly area.

Parking Lot Area

- If already in the parking lot:
 - o Move to a designated safe zone away from traffic flow.

- o Keep all drive lanes clear for emergency vehicles.

Secondary Evacuation Area

If the main entrance/parking lot is unsafe or blocked:

- Move to a safe perimeter area along Harrison Ave sidewalks.
- Stay clear of roadways and emergency vehicle access routes.
- Await further direction from:

- o League officials.

- o First responders.

Emergency Evacuation Procedures

1. Stop all play immediately.
2. Coaches account for all players.
3. Direct evacuation using nearest safe route.
4. Do not allow running or panic.
5. Keep emergency access lanes clear.
6. Proceed to designated assembly area.
7. Do not re-enter fields until cleared.

FIRST AID & INJURY PREVENTION

A prepared volunteer is better equipped to respond when injuries or medical situations occur. Below is an overview of the first aid training, equipment, and safety practices in place for the season.

First Aid Training

First aid training helps volunteers respond effectively when injuries or emergencies happen. These trainings reinforce skills such as:

- Treating minor injuries
- Managing bleeding and nosebleeds
- Recognizing potential fractures or serious injuries
- Identifying head-injury symptoms
- Responding to heat-related illness
- Treating allergic reactions
- Knowing when to call 911

First aid training requirements for CHELTENHAM LL:

- Little League First Aid Awareness Training: **Recommended**
- Formal First Aid Certification: **Recommended**
- CPR Certification and AED Use Training: **Recommended**

First Aid Kits

Accessible first aid supplies help volunteers respond quickly when an injury occurs. Keeping first aid kits stocked and easy to reach helps volunteers respond quickly during games and practices. Every team in CHELTENHAM LL has a first aid kit available at games and practices.

Recommended First Aid Kit Contents:

- Adhesive bandages (various sizes)
- Sterile gauze pads and rolled gauze
- Antiseptic wipes
- Instant cold packs
- Elastic wraps
- Tweezers and disposable gloves
- Nosebleed supplies (gauze, tissues)
- Small splint or finger splint
- CPR mask or face shield
- Allergy/sting relief wipes
- Cold Packs
- Tape and scissors

Best Practice: Each team should receive its first aid kit at the start of the season. First aid kits should travel with the team and be kept in an easy-to-reach spot during both games and practices.

Concussion Awareness

CHELTENHAM LL has confirmed that it follows required concussion training and has a protocol in place for recognizing and responding to potential head injuries during practices and games. Little League encourages all volunteers to follow the "When in doubt, sit them out" approach so players are removed from play immediately if a concussion is suspected.

Common signs and symptoms of a possible concussion include:

- Headache or pressure in the head
- Dizziness or balance problems
- Confusion, memory issues, or appearing "out of it"
- Nausea or vomiting
- Blurred vision or sensitivity to light or noise
- Behavior that seems unusual for the player

State concussion laws vary across the country. Some apply only to school athletics, while others apply to all youth sports organizations. Your league is responsible for understanding and complying with any applicable state laws.

Best Practice: If a concussion is suspected, volunteers should follow these steps:

- Remove the player from play immediately
- Ensure the player is monitored by an adult
- Refer the player to a licensed health care professional for evaluation
- Do not allow return to play on the same day
- Require written medical clearance before the player resumes practices or games

Access to Automated External Defibrillators (AED)

AEDs can play a lifesaving role during sudden cardiac emergencies, and clear access helps volunteers respond quickly when every second matters.

CHELTENHAM LL has reported that it has AEDs available at all league facilities.

Best Practice: AEDs are most effective when:

- Volunteers know the exact location of each device
- Devices are accessible during practices and games
- Batteries and pads are checked and replaced as needed
- Multiple volunteers are trained in basic AED use

State laws addressing AED access and sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) training can vary across the country. Some requirements apply only to school facilities or interscholastic athletics, while others extend to youth sports organizations or municipal fields. Your league is responsible for understanding and complying with any applicable state laws.

Additional information provided by your league:

To ensure readiness for all games and practices, Cheltenham Little League maintains stocked and accessible first aid supplies at all complexes.

Inventory Check Requirements:

First aid kits must be checked weekly during the season.

1. Additional check should occur:

- Before Opening Day.
- Prior to tournaments/events.
- After any major incident or heavy usage.

2. Responsible Party:

- League Safety Officer (Primary Oversight).
- Coaches/Managers (Field-level checks before games/practices).

3. Minimum Required First Aid Kit Contents:

- Adhesive bandages (various sizes)
- Sterile gauze pads and rolls.
- Medical tape.
- Antiseptic Wipes.
- Instant cold packs.
- Elastic bandages (ACE wraps).
- Disposable gloves (non-latex).
- CPR mask/barrier device.
- Scissors.
- Tweezers.
- Emergency blanket.
- Concussion information sheet.

4. Inspection Checklist:

- Items are present and not expired.
- Packaging is intact and sterile.

- Gloves and PPE are available.
- Kit is clean, dry, and accessible.

5. Restocking Procedures

- When to Restock:
 - o Immediately after any item is used.
 - o During weekly inspections.
 - o When supplies are expired or damaged.

6. Restocking Process:

- Coach/Volunteer notifies Safety Officer of missing/used items.
- Safety Officer logs needed supplies.
- Supplies are replenished within 48 hours.
- Restocked kits are verified and returned to service.

7. Storage Locations:

- Each field (portable first aid kits).
- Snack stand (primary supply backup location).

8. AED Availability

- AED Location:
 - o Woodland Complex: Inside the Snack Stand
- Accessibility:
 - o AED must be clearly marked and accessible at all times during games/practices.
 - o Signage should be posted at:
 - Each field entrance.
 - Snack Stand.
 - Main complex entrance.
- AED Maintenance:
 - o Checked monthly by Safety Officer.
 - o Ensure: Battery is functional, pads are within expiration date, Unit powers on and passes self-test.

9. Designated Responders

- Primary Responders:
- Team Managers/Coaches
- League Safety Officer.
- Any volunteer with CPR/AED certification.
- Expectations:
 - o At least one responsible adult per team should be familiar with:
 - First aid basics
 - AED usage
 - Emergency procedures.

10. Recommended (not required but strongly encouraged):

- CPR/AED certification for coaches and volunteers.
- Annual review of emergency procedures.

11. Medical Emergency Communication Plan

- Step-by-Step Response:
 - o Assess the situation: Determine severity of injury / illness
 - Call 911 (if necessary)
 - Provide:
 - o Location: Woodland Complex, 650 Woodland Ave, Cheltenham, PA 19012
 - o Field number
 - o Nature of emergency

Activate Internal Communication

- Notify:
 - o Safety Officer
 - o League officials (if needed)

Retrieve Equipment

- First aid kit

- AED (from snack stand if required)

Assign Roles

- One person provides care
- One person calls 911
- One person meets EMS at entrance

Control the Scene

- Keep spectators back
- Maintain clear access for EMS

Parent/Guardian Notification

- Notify immediately for any injury
- Provide updates as appropriate

Follow-Up Communication

Report incident to Safety Officer

Submit incident documentation within 24 hours

12. EMS Coordination Protocol

Primary Access Point: Woodland Ave entrance

- Assign a volunteer to:
 - o Meet EMS at entrance
 - o Escort to exact field location
- Important Information for EMS:
 - o Field number/location
 - o Condition of the individual
 - o Care already provided

Documentation Requirement

1. All medical incidents must be:

- o Documented (Use Incident/Injury Form) within 24 hours

2. Documentation Includes:

- o Date/Time
- o Location
- o Description of incident
- o Action taken
- o Witnesses
- o EMS involvement

13. Concussion

Concussion Protocols:

- Immediate Action: Removal From Play
- Stop participation immediately
- The player is removed from play and will not return the same day
- The incident is documented and reported to the Safety Officer

Emergency Warning Signs (Call 911)

- Worsening headache or repeated vomiting
- Seizure or convulsions
- Increasing confusion, agitation, or unusual behavior
- One pupil larger than the other
- Slurred speech, weakness, numbness, or poor coordination
- Cannot be awakened or condition worsens

Medical Evaluation Requirement

A player with a suspected concussion must be evaluated by an appropriate healthcare professional. Cheltenham Little League requires written clearance before the player can begin any return-to-play progression. Families should follow medical guidance regarding rest, school accommodations, and activity restrictions.

Return-To-Play

A player may return to baseball or softball activities only after symptoms have resolved, written medical clearance has been provided, and the league has confirmed approval to begin a gradual return-to-play progression.

14. Hydration Safety

1. Proper hydration is essential for all players to perform safely and avoid heat-related illnesses. Players should bring a filled water bottle to every practice and game.
2. Water breaks should be scheduled at least every 20-30 minutes, more frequently in hot weather.
3. Coaches should encourage players to drink before they feel thirsty.
4. Sports drinks may be allowed for long or intense activities, but water is the preferred choice.
5. Signs of dehydration (fatigue, dizziness, dry mouth, confusion) should be treated immediately - stop the activity and rehydrate.
6. On extremely hot days, shorten practices or add additional rest and hydration breaks.
7. A parent or guardian is notified immediately

EQUIPMENT SAFETY

Safe, well-maintained equipment helps prevent injuries and supports a positive playing experience. The information below reflects how playing equipment is inspected and monitored throughout the season.

Batting Helmets

All batting helmets must be NOCSAE-certified and free of cracks, dents, or deteriorating padding.

- Helmets are inspected at the start of the season and as needed
- Damaged or ill-fitting helmets are removed from use immediately
- Non-OEM (non-manufacturer) modifications are prohibited
- Properly fitted, undamaged helmets play an important role in preventing head injuries

Catcher's Gear

Catcher's equipment must be complete, well-maintained, and properly fitted for each player. A full set includes:

- Helmet with full face mask
- Dangling throat guard (required)
- Chest protector
- Leg guards

Equipment Inspections

At CHELTENHAM LL, coach or manager carry out regular equipment inspections throughout the season. These checks help identify items that should be repaired or removed from use.

- Unsafe or excessively worn equipment should be removed immediately
- Routine inspections help ensure players are always using equipment that will keep them safe from injury

Best Practice: Teach players to do quick self-checks of their helmets and gear before practices and games. Helping players look for cracks, loose padding, or missing pieces builds good habits and supports a shared culture of safety.

Additional information provided by your league:

EQUIPMENT SAFETY CHECKS:

1. Before Each Game/Practice: Inspect helmets, bats, gloves, and catcher's gear for cracks, damage, or loose fittings.
2. Check that batting helmets fit snugly and have face guards (face guards for softball only).
3. Verify catcher's gear includes a full set: helmet with throat guard (throat guard optional), chest protector, leg guards, and athletic cup.
4. Ensure bats are Little League approved and meet current regulations.
5. No jewelry should be worn during play (except medical ID tags).
6. Field Check: Coaches should walk the field before use to remove rocks, debris, or hazards.
7. Damaged or non-compliant equipment must be removed from play immediately and reported to the Safety Officer.

FACILITY SAFETY

Safe, well-maintained facilities help create a positive experience for players, families, and volunteers. Your league has shared the steps it takes to help keep playing conditions safe throughout the season.

Seasonal Facility Inspection

CHELTENHAM LL completes a thorough review of all fields and facilities at the beginning and end of each season.

This inspection helps the league:

- Identify needed repairs
- Document safety concerns
- Plan for maintenance or improvements
- Confirm that fields and common areas are ready for use

Ongoing Facility Checks

CHELTENHAM LL conducts regular in-season checks to help ensure facilities remain safe and ready for play. These checks typically look for:

- Loose or damaged fencing
- Worn or broken bases
- Slick, uneven, or poorly drained surfaces
- Broken or unstable bleachers
- Lighting or electrical concerns
- Hazards in dugouts, walkways, or spectator areas

Field Safety

Before every game and practice, fields and dugouts should be reviewed to ensure safe playing conditions. These quick checks help volunteers:

- Spot hazards early
- Prevent injuries
- Address small issues before they become larger concerns
- Confirm that field equipment, playing surfaces, and dugout areas are safe and ready for use

At CHELTENHAM LL, coach or manager carry out field and dugout safety checks before games and practices.

Annual Little League Facility Survey

Each year, leagues complete the Little League Annual Facility Survey, which records the condition of each field, identifies maintenance or safety needs, and documents key details about layout, features, and emergency equipment.

A report generated from CHELTENHAM LL's completed facility survey is included with this SAFE Summary.

Best Practice: Create a simple, shared inspection checklist for coaches and volunteers to use before games and practices. Consistent use of the same checklist helps ensure issues are spotted early and reported quickly.

FACILITIES SAFETY & MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

1. Additional Inspections

Cheltenham Little League is committed to maintaining safe playing environment through routine and event-based inspections.

Pre-Use Inspection (Before Games/Practices):

- Field surface checked for:
 - o Holes, uneven areas, or debris
 - o Standing water or unsafe conditions
- Bases and pitching mounds properly secured.
- Fences and gates intact and closed properly.
- Dugouts inspected for hazards.
- Walking and spectator areas clear.

Weekly Facility Inspections:

- Conducted by Safety Officer or designated board member
- Includes:
 - o Fields (all playing surfaces).
 - o Bleachers and seating areas.
 - o Lighting systems.
 - o Restrooms and snack stand areas.
 - o Parking lots and walkways.

Post-Incident Inspections:

- Any area involved in an incident must be re-inspected before reuse.

2. Maintenance Routines

Daily (Games Days):

- Drag and line fields as needed.
- Remove trash and debris.
- Check equipment (bases, fencing, nets).

Weekly:

- Mow grass and maintain infield dirt levels.
- Inspect and tighten bleachers and benches.
- Check batting cages and nets for damage.
- Inspect signage (safety signs, AED signs).

Seasonal:

- Full field conditioning (grading, seeding, lining).
- Fence and structure repairs.
- Equipment inventory and replacement.
- Safety equipment review (first aid kits, AED checks).

3. Hazard Reporting Procedures

All volunteers, coaches, and parents are encourage to report hazards immediately.

Examples of Hazards:

- Damaged fencing or equipment.
- Unsafe field conditions.
- Broken benches or bleachers.
- Lighting issues.
- Trip hazards (holes, debris, uneven surfaces).

Reporting Process:

1. Notify the Safety Officer immediately.
2. If urgent, stop play and secure the area.
3. Submit hazard details via:
 - o Email: cheltenhamllsafety@outlook.com
4. Include:
 - o Location (field/area).
 - o Description of hazard.
 - o Photo (if possible).

Response:

- Hazards will be addressed as soon as possible.
- Unsafe areas will remain closed until resolved.

4. Lighting Controls

- Lights are only to be operated by authorized personnel.
- Lights must be turned on:
 - o Prior to dusk games/practices.
 - o Early enough to ensure full visibility.
- Lights must be turned off:
 - o Immediately after games/practices.

Safety Checks:

- Report any non-functioning lights immediately.
- Ensure no exposed wiring or damaged fixtures.

Emergency Use:

- Lighting may be used to assist with emergency response if needed.

5. Dugout Safety Rules

To ensure player safety, the following rules must be strictly enforced in all dugouts:

General Rules:

- No horseplay or rough behavior.
- Players must remain seated unless preparing to bat or enter the field.
- Equipment (bats, helmets, bags) must be kept organized.

STRICTLY PROHIBITED:

- No swinging bats inside the dugout.
- No climbing or hanging on fences.
- No running inside the dugout.
- NO SWINGING ON THE POLE (support poles/fencing).

Supervision:

- Coaches are responsible for maintaining order and enforcing all rules.

6. Facility-Specific Standards

Cheltenham Little League facilities must meet the following standards:

Fields

- Clearly marked baselines and batter's boxes.
- Secure bases and pitching rubber.
- Properly maintained grass and infield.

Bleachers & Seating

- Stable and secure.
- Free from damage or sharp edges.
- Positioned safely away from field of play

Walkways & Parking Areas

- Clear of obstructions.
- Well-lit during evening use.
- Safe pedestrian access maintained.

Snack Stand & Restrooms

- Clean and sanitary.
- Proper waste disposal available.
- No safety hazards (wet floors, exposed wires, etc.)

Batting Cages

- Nets intact and secured.
- L-screens in good condition.
- Supervised during use.

7. Enforcement & Accountability

- Coaches and volunteers are responsible for enforcing safety standards.
- The Safety Officer will:
 - o Monitor compliance.

o Address violations.

o Recommend corrective actions.

CONCESSION STAND SAFETY

Concession stands add to the game day experience, but they also involve equipment, heat sources, and food handling, all of which require clear safety procedures. The information below summarizes how CHELTENHAM LL helps maintain a safe concession operation throughout the season.

CHELTENHAM LL has confirmed that its concession stand(s):

- Follow all applicable local health and safety regulations
- Provide volunteers with guidance in safe food handling and equipment use
- Maintain a working fire extinguisher that is readily available
- Keep first aid supplies in the concession stand
- Do not allow minors to work in or remain inside the concession stand during operating hours

Best practice: Post simple safety reminders inside the concession stand so volunteers can quickly review expectations before each shift, including:

- Handwashing steps
- Safe food temperatures
- Equipment shut-off procedures
- Location of the fire extinguisher
- Emergency contact information

Additional information provided by your league:

CONCESSION STAND POLICIES AND GUIDELINES:

1. All concession volunteers will have a basic knowledge in First Aid will be instructed by the Safety Officer or Concessions Manager in basic safety guidelines for concessions.
2. Keep your menu simple, and keep potentially hazardous foods (meat, eggs, dairy products, protein salads, cut fruits and vegetables, etc.) to a minimum. Avoid using precooked foods or leftovers. Use only foods from approved sources, avoiding foods that have been prepared at home. Having complete control over your food, from source to service, is the key to safe, sanitary food service.
3. Have a food thermometer available in the concession stand to ensure foods are cooked to a safe internal temperature. For more information on safe and appropriate cooking temperatures, please visit www.foodsafety.gov for more information.
4. Concession stand volunteer/employees will use clean-up guidelines/protocols for opening and closing the concession stand/area.
5. Rinse and store your wiping cloths in a bucket of sanitizer (example: 1 gallon of water and 1/2 teaspoon of chlorine bleach). Change the solution every two hours. Well sanitized work surfaces prevent cross contamination and discourage insects.
6. Keep foods covered to protect them from insects. Store pesticides away from foods. Place garbage and paper wastes in a refuse container with a tight-fitting lid. Dispose of wastewater in an approve method (DO NOT DUMP IT OUTSIDE). All water used should be potable water from an approved source.
7. Concession Stand hand hygiene and food preparation procedures should be posted in the stand (e.g., handwashing, safe food handling procedures, etc.).
8. Grills/hotplates/fryers may not be attended by anyone under the age of 18.
9. All other concession stand volunteers must be at least 16 years of age.

Children under the age of 16 should not be in any area of the concession stand.

Concession stand volunteers/employees should make other arrangements for supervising their children.

10 Workers should wash hands with soap and water frequently for at least 20 seconds each time. In addition, disposable gloves are highly recommended, but not a substitution for hand washing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surface of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.

11. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.

12. Safe food handling procedures should be practiced, including avoiding direct contact with food.

13. Utensils and/or gloves should always be utilized when handling food.

14. Only healthy workers should volunteer in the concession stand. Anyone who shows symptoms of illness (e.g., fever, hacking cough, nausea, sneezing, nasal drip, etc.) or who has visible/uncovered injuries on the hands should

not be allowed to work in the concession stand/area unless providing they wear gloves or is limited to only serving prepackages items (e.g., chips, soda, candy, etc.).

15. Workers should wear clean outer garments, and the use of hair restraints is recommended to prevent hair ending up in food products. There should be no use of tobacco in or near the concession area or throughout you complex.

16. Use disposable utensils for food service, ideally in individual packaging. Keep your hands away from food contact surfaces, and never reuse disposable dishware. Wash in a four-step process:

Washing in hot soapy water.

Rinsing in clean water.

Chemical or heat sanitizing.

Air drying.

17. In those situations when health concerns are impacting our community, additional sanitation protocols should be implemented; including but not limited to, workers wearing mask and practicing social distancing. In addition, items for sale should be limited to pre-packaged foods, and canned or bottled beverages. For further direction and information reference the Center for Disease Control (www.cdc.gov) for protocol and procedures.

18. Concession stand volunteers will inspect the concession area for any safety violations and report them to the Safety Officer using the safety violations form.

19. Concession stand manager and volunteer's will be designated by the Safety Officer.

COOKS:

1. Wash hands before touching food or food containers.

2. Do not take more meat out of the freezer than what will be cooked within 15 minutes.

3. All hamburgers will be well done cooked (NO EXCEPTIONS).

Be careful when putting food into the fryer. Splashed or splattered grease can cause serious burns.

AT OPENING:

1. Upon arriving at the concession stand, or designated concession area space, inspect the outside of the building/space for potential safety hazards to patrons.

2. Once inside the building or designated space, conduct a safety check of the working, and frequent traffic, areas to be used by the concession staff.

3. Emergency contact information is to be prominently displayed and referenced during a brief safety review/orientation that is to take place prior to each time the concession stand/area opens for business.

AT CLOSING:

1. Clean counter tops antibacterial cleanser.

2. Clean all cooking utensils in hot soapy water and place in rack to air dry.
3. Discard any leftover cooked good in a seal bag.
4. Empty trashcans to the outside dumpster and place clean bags in all cans.

COUNTER WORKERS:

1. Wash hands before beginning work. Dry hands with paper towels, not dishtowels.
2. Clean up spills, as they occur to prevent accidents. Re-wash hands using any clean product.

TRAINING & EDUCATION

When volunteers are trained and prepared, it helps to prevent injuries, respond to emergencies, and create a positive experience for everyone involved. This section highlights the volunteer trainings that CHELTENHAM LL requires and encourages.

Abuse Awareness Training

Little League requires all volunteers who undergo a background check to complete Abuse Awareness Training each year. CHELTENHAM LL confirms that all required volunteers complete Abuse Awareness Training each season.

Safety Awareness Training (Little League University)

Safety Awareness Training helps volunteers understand common safety risks, recognize unsafe situations, and take proactive steps to prevent injuries.

CHELTENHAM LL requires Safety Awareness Training for: League Officers/Board Members, Managers and Coaches, Umpires, All Other Volunteers.

First Aid Awareness Training (Little League University)

First Aid Awareness Training helps volunteers recognize injuries, respond appropriately, know when to call 911, and take steps to prevent medical emergencies.

CHELTENHAM LL requires First Aid Awareness Training for Not Required in our League.

Diamond Leader Training (Little League University)

Diamond Leader Training supports coaches and volunteers in creating a positive team environment focused on player well-being, sportsmanship, communication, and healthy culture.

CHELTENHAM LL requires Diamond Leader Training for Not Required in our League.

Additional Trainings Offered or Encouraged

CHELTENHAM LL has indicated that it offers or requires the following additional trainings:

- Concession Safety Training

Best practice: Share a simple training plan at the start of the season outlining required courses, who must complete them, and suggested deadlines. Clear expectations help volunteers stay on track.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE & INCIDENT REPORTING

Accidents can happen at any time, and being prepared helps leagues support families and volunteers when they do. Understanding and documenting injuries ensures everyone gets the help they need and allows the league to strengthen safety practices for future seasons.

How to Submit an Accident Claim

If a player or volunteer requires medical treatment after a league-sanctioned activity, families should follow these steps:

1. Download the Accident Claim Form from LittleLeague.org.
2. Provide the claimant's full information, including parent or guardian details if the claimant is a minor.
3. Complete all sections of the form. Missing information causes delays.
4. Include primary insurance information. If the claimant has no insurance, written employer verification is required.
5. Attach itemized medical bills that include dates of service, procedure codes, diagnosis codes, and charges.
6. For dental injuries, submit bills to the primary medical and dental insurer first, then include the insurer's Explanation of Benefits.
7. Have a league official (President, Safety Officer, etc.) complete and sign the League Statement section.
8. Completed claim forms and supporting documents must be mailed. Email and fax submissions cannot be accepted.

Incident Tracking

CHELTENHAM LL documents all injuries and incidents that occur during league activities.

- Reports are completed using the official Little League Incident Tracking Form.
- A designated league officer is responsible for collecting and reviewing each report.
- Reviewing incident information throughout the season helps the league identify trends, address hazards, and strengthen safety practices.

Best practice: Monitor incident reports and near-miss situations regularly during the season. Tracking both helps identify emerging patterns, field conditions, equipment problems, or other safety concerns, so the league can take proactive steps to prevent injuries and improve the overall safety of the program.

Incident/Injury Reporting Policy

WHAT TO REPORT:

1. All accidents/incident which cause an injury and require First Aid, or any medical attention whether the treatment was on or off CLL site must be reported to the Safety Office within a 24-HOUR timeframe.
2. Any near miss incident must be reported to the Safety Officer within a 24-HOUR timeframe.
3. Near Miss Incident: Where a person nearly misses being injured while at one of the Cheltenham Little League Complex's. These near misses can be a safety hazard that needs to be addressed before an actual injury does occur. (THIS HELPS CLL TO IDENTIFY SAFETY AREAS OF CONCERNS).

WHO'S RESPONSIBLE FOR FILING THE REPORT:

1. Incidents/Injuries to players:

Managers, Coaches, Parents, and League Officials.

2. Incidents/Injuries to volunteer/spectators:

Managers, Coaches, and League Officials.

HOW TO REPORT:

1. Complete the Incident/Injury Report Form. The form can be downloaded by clicking [here](#).
2. All sections of the Incident/Injury Report Form must be complete.
3. In an emergency situation, make sure at least the contact section of the report is complete.

All incidents should be reported to the Safety Officer as soon as possible but no later than 24-HOURS after the incident.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF SAFETY OFFICER DURING INCIDENT/INJURY:

1. The Safety Officer will investigate all incidents/injuries and take the appropriate action.
2. The Safety Officer will contact the injured party(s) or their parents/guardian within 48-HOURS of receiving the Incident/Injury Report to ensure:

The current condition of the injured party(s).

To verify that all the information on the Incident/Injury Report is accurate.

To obtain any supplemental information (as needed).

3. If a player misses seven (07) or more continuous days of participation, a physician or other accredited medical provider must give written permission for a full return to baseball/softball activity. This also applies to a player that seeks professional medical treatment, whether the injury took place during a CLL activity or during a non-CLL activity (ex. Hospital, Primary Doctor, and Urgent Care).

4. The Safety Officer will forward all incident/injury information to the Board of Directors.
5. The Safety Officer will continue to make periodic follow-ups as necessary until the incident/injury can be considered closed.
6. All Incident/Injury Reports will be kept on file for two years.

HOW TO SUBMIT INCIDENT/INJURY FORM:

The Incident/Injury Reporting Form can be emailed or given in person to the League Safety Officer.

LITTLE LEAGUE RULES & SAFETY BEST PRACTICES

Creating a safe, enjoyable playing environment begins with following Little League's official safety rules and reinforcing practices that protect players, volunteers, and families. CHELTENHAM LL has confirmed that it meets all required safety standards.

Little League Safety Rules

Little League's official safety rules are designed to prevent injuries and establish consistent expectations across the program. These rules help ensure safe play during practices and games.

Leagues must enforce the following:

- On-deck batters are not permitted in the Majors Division and below
- Batters, base runners, and player base coaches must wear helmets at all times
- Catcher's gear must include a dangling throat guard
- Metal cleats are prohibited in the Majors Division and below
- Disengageable bases are required on all baseball and softball fields
- Head-first sliding while advancing is not permitted in the Majors Division and below
- Pitch count limits and required rest days must be followed in all baseball divisions
- Bats must meet current Little League standards
- Game balls must meet current Little League standards and be in good condition

Safety Best Practices

In addition to official rules, many leagues adopt extra safety practices that strengthen routines, reinforce expectations, and create a positive environment for players, families, and volunteers.

Common safety best practices include:

- Keeping dugout and field gates closed during play
- Using a double first base on baseball and softball fields
- Reminding players not to throw equipment or swing bats near others
- Reviewing lightning and severe weather procedures with coaches and umpires
- Ensuring each team has emergency contact information available at practices and games
- Leading age-appropriate warm-ups and stretching to reduce injury risk
- Marking spectator areas clearly and keeping them separate from the field
- Encouraging volunteers, parents, and players to model sportsmanlike and respectful behavior
- Sharing safety reminders with families (emails, signage, or meetings)
- Posting safety signage in common areas (e.g., "No Climbing Fences," "Foul Ball Awareness," "AED Located Here")

SAFETY RULES

Safety is our top priority at Cheltenham Little League. To ensure a fun and secure environment for all players, coaches, volunteers, and spectators, the following safety rules are in place:

Protective Gear:

1. Batters, base runners, and catchers must wear helmets at all times.
2. Catcher must use full protective gear (mask with throat guard, chest protector, shin guards, and catcher's mitt).
3. Male catchers must wear a protective cup.

Bat & Equipment Safety:

1. Only one player is allowed in the on-deck area at a time.
2. Bats should never be swung outside of the batter's box.
3. Players should store personal equipment in dugouts or on the field.

Injury Prevention:

1. No horseplay, running, or roughhousing in dugouts or on the field.
2. Coaches must inspect the field before each game/practice for unsafe conditions.
3. Any player injured must be reported immediately to the Safety Officer.

Weather Safety:

1. Play must stop immediately if lightning is seen or thunder is heard.
2. Players and families must move to a safe shelter until cleared by officials.

General Conduct:

1. Only authorized coaches, players, and volunteers are permitted in dugouts or on the field.
2. Parents and spectators must stay in designated areas, clear of the dugouts and field of play.

Safety is Everyone's Responsibility:

1. All volunteers, coaches, parents, and players share responsibility for maintaining a safe environment.
2. When in doubt, err on the side of safety - stop play, check conditions, and report concerns to the League Safety Officer.
